SOTA/Board Professional Development Fund 2023-24 Professional Development

The Manitoba Teachers' Society states that "professional development encompasses all activities that teachers undertake to direct their own learning and to enhance their professional practice.".

Through the SOTA/Board Professional Development Fund, teachers have a variety of ways to access autonomous PD. These include:

In-Province Funding

In-province funding encompasses workshops, conferences, classroom/site visitations, cooperating teacher/teacher candidate collaboration and webinars.

Tuition Fees

As a part of the in-province funding area, tuition and continuance fees from an accredited post-secondary institution toward a graduate degree in education are reimbursed at 1/3 the tuition/continuance fee amount to a maximum of \$500.

Member Initiated Project Grant (MIP)

Under the umbrella of in-province funding, the MIP grant supports members to develop teaching strategies and support materials related to their practice with funds up to \$800.

Out of Province Funding

The out of province fund enables members to attend conferences in Canada and the continental United States once every three years.

Educational Leave

Ed Leave supports members through providing funds for release time for teachers to discuss, research, observe and/or investigate educational topics. Release days related to post-graduate study may also be covered by this fund.

SOTA/Board PD Fund Q&A

How much funding am I eligible fo this year?

You may be approved for funding for up to **TWO** activities per year not including Educational Leave and the MTS PD Day. (Out-of-Province eligibility is once every three years)

How do I apply to the SOTA/Board PD Fund?

1) Log into Employee Connect.

2) On your Profile click on Absence, then from the drop-down menu click on Leave Request.

3) Select from the Add Leave Type menu (choices are PD Board/SOTA Out of Province Conference, PD Board/SOTA In Province Conference, or PD Board/SOTA or PD Board/SOTA In Province Workshop) and click on the Add button.

Professional Development activity

The expense claim form is to be submitted with your <u>INDIVIDUAL</u> conference receipts to the SOBO within 30 days of your PD Activity. If you attended an OUT-OF-PROVINCE conference, a conference report must be submitted along with the expense claim form, in order to process your reimbursement.



Project Overseas


Project Overseas




