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Over the past few months, Manitoba public school teachers have been raising their voices on educational matters (#raiseyourvoice). Teachers from across the province made in-person presentations and written submissions to the Standing Committee of Social and Economic Development on Bill 35 - The Education Administration Amendment Act (Teacher Certification and Professional Conduct). The government made several amendments to Bill 35 after the committee hearings. Education Minister Wayne Ewasko said the amendments were a direct result of feedback received during the committee hearings.

MTS recently launched a campaign called #RealTeacherTalkMB. The object of the campaign is to amplify the voices of MTS members, who have responded to The Society's call to provide comments on ways chronic underfunding has impacted their classrooms. MTS has posted these comments to its social media channels steadily over the past weeks and is now ready to draw the attention of the public to comments posted to #RealTeacherTalkMB. The #RealTeacherTalkMB campaign went into market the first week of May. Transit ads in Winnipeg along with billboards in urban and rural Manitoba markets will be visible from May through the end of June, with the potential for additional exposure on other platforms, such as print and radio, over that eight-week period.

I encourage all SOTA members to take a look at what your colleagues from across the Province have to say about public education in Manitoba.



SOTA/Board Professional Development Fund Summer PD

All Professional Development activities (including Tuition) occurring in July, August and or September <u>must</u> be submitted on the first school day in June. This year that date is June 1st, 2023.

SOTA members are encouraged to apply for Professional Development opportunities including:

- In-province conferences or workshops
- Webinars
- Out of Province conferences
- Tuition

SOTA/Board PD Fund Q&A

Can I still apply for PD funding this school year?

Yes! You may be approved for funding for up to TWO activities per year. There are ample funds available to support autonomous teacher professional development.

when do I need to apply to the

fund?

The application deadline for In-Province requests is 10 calendar days prior to the start of the activity (including Tuition). For Out of Province requests, the application deadline for all conferences and workshops occurring in a given month, must be submitted by the first school day of the month <u>prior</u>.

What should I include for my rationale?

The following rationale must be included in your application in order for your request to be considered for funding: i) How does attending this PD inform your practice? ii) How does attending this PD impact your work in Seven Oaks? An incomplete rationale can result in the denial of a PD request.

Does the PD Fund cover tuition?

Yes! The Fund reimburses 1/3 eligible tuition from an accredited postsecondary institution up to a maximum of \$500 per 3 credit hours.


